Survival of a style icon

There's nothing shady in the proud history of Ray-Ban sunglasses.

Ray-Ban sunglasses today are still one of the most stylish designs but, most importantly, provide great eye protection and durability, which was why they were designed in the first place.

Over the brand's illustrious histroy, their sunglasses have been worn by presidents, actors, rock stars, sportsmen and every other kind of celebrity in between.

I've personally stayed with my 1980 tortoisehell wayfarers and gold metal aviator sunglasses.

Which ever sunglasses you opt for, however, there are few simple tips to keep in mind to find a pair that suits your hair and face shape. These include:

A round face suits straightangle frames that are rectangular or square. Think thin metal
frames.

A square face will balance better with rounded frames. Stay clear of rectangular frames as they will accentuate the squareness of your face.

If you've got a triangularshaped face, aim to downplay the width at the top of your face. Go for frames that aren't chunky and thick.

An oval face has more options, but try and stay away from frames that are too narrow.

■ Blond hair suits warm earthy tones like green, brown, gold and bronze. Choose black if you're looking to make a bolder statement.

If you've got brown or black hair- you're in luck! You'll suit most colours, such as gold and bronze and silver and blue tones.

Pewter and metal shades suit

those with grey hair.

If you're a redhead, you can't go wrong with green, gold and tortoiseshell shades.
